Terminology and land enhancement: between tradition and innovation

San Millán de la Cogolla (La Rioja, Spain), 24-25 October 2024

Since the dawn of humanity, we have used words to describe and understand our environment related to specialized activities developed in a fixed area. Every region in the world has a vocabulary that expresses particular geographical, climatic, cultural, and economic characteristics. Specialized activities such as agriculture, fishing, farming or mining have shaped and are still shaping language through the creation and use of terms to describe techniques, tools and phenomena associated with these practices. Thus, specialised activities and their terminology build a lexicon that shows wealth and diversity between people and their particular environments. Moreover, these linguistic landscapes often interact with other contexts and are connected globally, enriching the linguistic set. Not only does current research on terminology promote an exchange dialogue among disciplines, languages and subjects that respect tradition, but it also employs technology to ease knowledge management in an innovative way. In particular, new disruptive technologies are emerging in our current society under the umbrella of artificial intelligence. These tools can be useful in several aspects of the terminological area. That is the reason why synergies and shared objectives between tradition and innovation exist and bear in mind the idiosyncrasy of every land and language.

The 20th REALITER (Terminological Network of Romanic Languages) Scientific Conference and 23rdAETER (Spanish Association of Terminology) Conference intend to present the current terminological research dynamic to all the Spanish and Romanic languages researchers. Under the motto "Terminology and land enhancement: between tradition and innovation" this Conference tries to create a dialogue atmosphere that will lead to reflections from several perspectives.

The following are the research lines to be addressed. They belong to different points of view in order to explore the connection between terminology and other areas.

- a) Methodological approaches and terminological research
- b) Terminology and specialised translation
- c) Terminology and specialised language teaching
- d) Terminology, linguistic mediation and specialised communication
- e) Terminology and linguistic policies
- f) Terminology, new technologies and generative artificial intelligence.

Abstract proposals (around 400 words) can be submitted in .doc format until 17 May 2024. You can write the proposal in one of the official languages of REALITER (Catalan, French, Galician, Italian, Portuguese, Romanian and Spanish) through the <u>University of Valladolid web platform for events</u> (please, click on the link or scan the QR code below). The document in .doc format must contain only the tittle, the abstract and bibliographic references without any personal data. On the platform you should upload the document in .doc format and a picture of the author(s). On the text field you should enter the name of the author(s) and the organization you belong to.

All the proposals will be subject to blind evaluation by the Scientific Committee.
